Your letter should include:

- The personal qualities you possess which will enable you to fulfil a role within the team.
- How you have demonstrated these qualities already, either in or outside of school.
- What you think you can offer to the academy as a member of the team.

All applications received by the deadline will be carefully considered and shortlisted candidates will be invited to attend an interview with Mrs Green and Ms Phillip's shortly after the closing date. Following the interviews, Mrs Green and Ms Phillip's will appoint students to a role within the team which they feel you are most suited to. You do not need to state which role you are applying for.

Essential qualities for members of the Student Leadership Team

Good communication:

You should be able to talk confidently and appropriately in front of staff, parents, students and other external personnel where necessary.

Maturity:

You should uphold the academy's high expectations for attendance, work ethic and behaviour.

Leadership:

You should have the determination to work harder than most and make sure things get done.

Politeness:

You should be kind and courteous to all students, parents and staff.

Self-reliance:

You should be able to take responsibility and carry out the role to the best of your ability.

Time management:

You should be able to give your time when required to assist with the organisation of events such as Open Evening, Induction & Parents Evenings, Review days, Career & Guidance Evenings and Presentation Evenings.
